**LEADERSHIP TRAINING**

Last spring we, the people in White City, received a Leadership Grant from the Ford Family Foundation in Roseburg. We were extremely fortunate to get this grant because they have now limited their grants to cities farther away from a large population center.

They want their grants to go to small rural towns to help build leadership by giving them the training to make changes.

Our class will begin on February 1st. The classes are scheduled for Friday afternoon and all day Saturday once a month for four months. It also involves a weekend where you meet other classes from across the state.

This program involves five years of training, which means a long period of follow-through. At the end of five years some of the participants could become trainers.

**LONGVIEW MEET RESULTS**

Three swimmers from the Rogue Valley Swim Team, sponsored by the Cascade Community Pool, competed in the Killer Whales Winter Blast Swim Meet held in Longview, Washington on December 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>. Eight teams composed of 211 swimmers competed in the meet.

**Sabrina Edwards** competed for the first time in this meet. Coach, Carleen Camden, felt her swimmers put forth a great effort at this event.

**Kylee Burks** placed 6<sup>th</sup> in the 100 yd. back, 1:27.91, 10<sup>th</sup> in the 100 yd. IM, 1:26.22, 14<sup>th</sup> in the 50 yd. breast, 48.12, 14<sup>th</sup> in the 100 yd. breast, 1:41.06, 5<sup>th</sup> in the 50 yd. free, 32.94, 50 yd. back 40.51. **Kylee** swam personal bests in the 50 yd. free and the 50 yd. back.

**Caitlyn Camden** placed 9<sup>th</sup> in the 100 yd. back, 1:38.03, 14<sup>th</sup> in the 100 yd. IM, 1:41.04, 16<sup>th</sup> in the 50 yd. breast, 49.50, 19<sup>th</sup> in the 100 yd. breast, 1:46.50, 12<sup>th</sup> in the 50 yd. free, 36.28, 50 yd. back, 43.91.

**Sabrina Edwards** placed 22<sup>nd</sup> in the 50 yd. breast, 1:06.14, 20<sup>th</sup> in the 50 yd. free, 47.75, 50 yd. back, 51.01.
