FAULTY MOTHERBOARD

A new motherboard for our salt system has finally been shipped, note I did not say arrived. After keeping a log on the one installed when we received the power control box the company has agreed with us that the motherboard is not working correctly.



The rebuilt replacement they sent us did not turn the cell on at all so we had to reinstall the faulty one since it at least kept the cell working.

We are currently changing the current from positive to negative manually and the negative is having to work so hard to produce chlorine that it tends to turn the machine off after several hours.

The motherboard they are sending now is supposed to be new not reconditioned.
